

Fiber Fresh Arena – Turf Tech Report commends Grass Arena

The findings from the Ground Conditions Working Group have come back and the report shows the NEC grass arena (rings 1 and 2 for the Xmas Classic) are well up to spec.

"The surface has a very good ryegrass cover and is providing a very sympathetic footing for horses along with good stability," states the Turf Tech Report.

This a result has been greatly assisted by aerating and improved irrigation programme that has been implemented over the last year.

The NEC's new pump and irrigation system came into operation early this year and has enabled the Centre Manager, Mark Brunton, to disperse a better water spread and increased amount of water on the arena.

The grass species growing, fertiliser programme and weed spraying inputs that have been taking place over the last five years have also come to fruition and were complimented in the report.

Additional Surface Work Being Carried out on All Weather Arenas

Over the next 10 days volunteers will be working hard to carry out the on-going *Repair and Maintence* of the All-Weather arenas. Additional Cambridge Sand (the same sand as used at Mystery Creek) is being trucked in and will be added to both ring 3 and ring 4 (the pony ring).

The work could not take place until now as additional costs of completing the new covered yards complex took precedent.

A new grooming machine and additional watering will be in place for the show next week.

As usual the maintenance work on the arenas is on-going. We are extremely grateful to the hardworking volunteers who undertake it and the generosity of locals lending equipment to make it possible.















































The NEC committee have been working with the newly formed Ground Conditions Working Group since it formed earlier this year to improve all the surfaces at the NEC . While there is no overnight fix and the NEC is limited by financial constraints it is however always seeking funding and/or sponsorship for the R&M on the arenas so any support or assistance in this area would be greatly appreciated.



Horse Accommodation

We have been fortunate to secure additional temporary horse yards alond with the completed covered yard complex for the show this year, so we won't be feeling the squeeze we have in the past. This will enable us to hold entries open until Wednesday. The portable yards are being put up on Saturday morning so we do request that riders, especially those with bigger teams, get their entries in by Wednesday so we can get their horses accommodated and the yard list out by Monday. However, as always entries remain open after this date but late fees will apply.

Practise rounds available

The ever popular practise rounds in the training ring will be happening again this year. \$5 per round and pay at the gate. We are happy to accommodate additional horses this year – however we do request you pay the appropriate yarding/facility fee and advise as soon as possible fo any additional yarding requirements.

Late Fees

Online entry does not mean putting off payment! If you haven't paid for your online entries by Friday 12th December then late fees will apply.

Riders will be able to track how many horses have gone in a class so they are better able to manage multiple horses in multiple rings. We also plan to email riders with notices like classes are closing soon so you don't miss out.

Results will be emailed to all placegetters or riders in the bigger classes once they are finished. Draws will be uploaded to Main-Events.com regularly throughout the show to make this happen. However, this is all dependent on good internet connections and volunteer scorers in the ring with the judges!
