BEEF SECTION - RULES & REGULATIONS

Franklin Beef Cattle Show©

CHIEF STEWARD: Graham Potter

General rules and regulations for the governance and conduct of the Franklin A & P Show shall be the same as the rules and regulations as issued by the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (Inc) and it shall be deemed as if they have been printed in full in this Schedule. If any Exhibitor is not sure of the conditions he should get in touch with the Secretary.

PRIVACY ACT

The Society holds records and names and addresses of all members and exhibitors and will publish these as necessary for media show reports unless advised.

*** ENTRY FEES**

Unless otherwise stated,

Members \$7.00 Non-members \$12.00

All Breeds Classes

Members \$12.00 Non-members \$15.00

Member means financial member of the Franklin A $\&\,P$ Society. Cheques are to be made out to Franklin A $\&\,P$

Society.

NOTE 1: The Society reserves the right to merge classes if there are insufficient entries, and to amend or alter the program as it sees fit.

❖ ENTRIES CLOSE 22nd JANUARY 2016

Late entries will be accepted until Friday 12th February 2016, with a penalty of 50% on full entry fee. These entries will not necessarily be catalogued. No entries will be accepted after this date.

Animals may be substituted but only into the same class - the Office to be notified by 5.00pm on the day before competition.

❖ PRIZE MONEY

1st \$20.00 2nd \$15.00 3rd \$10.00 (Except where otherwise stated)

The Society reserves the right to substitute advertised prize money with either product or vouchers.

No prize money will be awarded unless the class is completed, as per the conditions of the class.

When there are fewer than three entries in any class only half prize money may be paid. In all classes with five or more entries, the judge shall award four placings. Ribbon only for 4^{th} place.

The stewards at the show may provisionally announce point's prizes.

❖ PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

Except where otherwise stated, where there are fewer than six entries, 1st & 2nd only will be paid. Fewer than 3 entries, 1st only will be paid. Ribbons will be awarded for other placings. All prize money is GST inclusive.

All prize monies will be paid out by cheque post show. Cheques are to be banked within 3 months of receipt, thereafter they will be cancelled.

*** EXHIBITOR PASSES**

Passes will be allocated to Exhibitors as follows:

Up to 3 animals 2 Passes 3 to 6 animals 3 Passes 6 and more animals 4 Passes

If you require more passes, please advise the Show Office.

All competitors who can't present tickets at the gate will be charged normal gate charges and there will be no refunds.

Exhibitors who wish to arrive on Friday evening should advise the office when placing entries for the show, to facilitate access to stalls.

Cattle remaining overnight must have neck ties in addition to halters.

OWNERSHIP

All cattle must be the property of the Exhibitor or be a leased animal with an official lease registered with the Breed society or the RAS.

Group owners of an animal may not claim Members' entry rates unless at least one owner is a Member of the Franklin A & P Society.

❖ ANIMAL REGISTRATION

All cattle entered in the Breed Classes must be entered or eligible for registration in the recognised Herd Books of the affiliated breed societies.

HIGHLAND CATTLE

The Highland cattle section is open to **all** Highland Cattle entered or eligible for registration with the RAS affiliated Highland Cattle Societies and are registered on the RAS Highland Show register. If the Show Register is not available at close off of entries, eligible entries will be determined by the RAS Liaison Committee.

* STRAW

Straw will be available if ordered and pre-paid for with entry (\$10.00 inc GST)

No green feed is available.

All beef cattle must be stalled by 8.45am on the Saturday of the show.

❖ CATTLE FRAMES

Space for frames must be booked with entries.

*** CATALOGUE NUMBERS**

All cattle shall wear a catalogue number when parading in the ring for judging, but no animal shall wear an award ribbon or card awarded in a previous class while in the ring for judging in any special class or for the Championship awards.

Failure to return these to the designated steward will result in charge of \$10 being levied.

*** SPECIAL CONDITIONS**

All cattle entered in group or special classes must be exhibited in open classes.



SHOWING CONDITIONS

No badges or ribbons other than those won at this Show shall be displayed either on the stalls or in the Cattle Parade.

Bulls 12 months and over MUST be rung and led with two leads, with one lead attached to the ring.

It is compulsory that all beef females (born before 31 December 2012) must led by a halter and nose clip.

Attendants to wear white coats or official breed uniform in the ring please. No commercial or stud logos are to be worn on any apparel in the ring. Feed boxes will not be provided.

POINTS

1st 6, 2nd 4, 3rd 2, 4th 1. In the event of a tie a count back will take place.

***** CHAMPIONS AND RESERVE CHAMPIONS

Champions will be selected in the following order. First prize winner in all classes shall parade before the judge for his selection of Champion. As soon as the selection is made the second prize winner in the Class in which the Champion is first will parade with the others for Reserve Champion.

❖ TB POLICY

All Cattle entered for a showing or exhibiting must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd . A copy of the current TB Test Allocation Certificate must accompany the entry forms. The Society must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may

arise after entries are submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form. There are two documents required:-

- TB test certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control area- all animals aged 3 months or older are to be TB tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with its current TB testing routine.
- TB Animal Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear Status in accordance with the present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards <u>must</u> be carried on day of Show and may be inspected at the loading area.

* NAIT

A NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags.

PROTESTS

All protests are to be lodged at the Secretaries office within 30 minutes of the event. Protests must be in writing and accompanied by a \$50.00 cash deposit. This will be refunded if the protest is upheld.

Where necessary, Franklin A & P Society will adjudicate in all matters other than judging and such a decision shall be final. It may be necessary to make changes to the programme, prizes or judges because of circumstances beyond our control. No correspondence will be entered into.

❖ SPORTSMANSHIP:

The purpose of our show is to provide our community & visiting competitors the opportunity to have an enjoyable day of fun & competition, therefore any person or persons who verbally or otherwise abuses fellow competitors, stewards, judges or show officials may be asked, at the discretion of the show committee, to leave the showgrounds.

❖ INSURANCE

Franklin A&P Society will not be held liable for loss or damage to exhibitors/competitor or their property whilst on the grounds. If individual breed numbers are sufficient, a separate breed section may be accommodated at the discretion of the Show Committee. The committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes in breed rings. Where there are insufficient entries, rings or classes may be combined or deleted. See each section.

* ARREARS

Any competitor found to be in arrears with any other affiliated Society, may be refused entry to Franklin A&P Show

EVENT CANCELLATION

If the show is abandoned or postponed due to any reason beyond the control of the Show Organiser, the Show Organiser is under no obligation to refund in whole or in part, any payments made by the exhibitors. Any refund will be made at the discretion of the Franklin Agricultural and Pastoral Society.

CATALOGUES are to be pre- ordered and paid for with entries, see entry form.

Malcolm HutchingsNorthern District Council RAS Young Handlers Competition for Dairy and Beef

Rules

- This competition is run in the Northern District only, but any competitor in New Zealand can enter.
- Competitors aged 8-19 years are eligible to enter. The junior class is 8-12 years (inclusive) while the senior is 13-19 years (inclusive). All ages are as of October 1st of the current show season.
- Entry is to be free to all competitors.
- The competitor may use cattle of any age and the animal does not have to be the property of the handler.
- The competitor may only enter the beef or dairy class, not both.
- To be eligible for the Northern District prize, the competitor must compete in three or more Northern District A&P Shows in the chosen class for the current Show season.
- The final show of the season is at Auckland. Competitors are not required to compete at that show but they must attend the prize giving shortly thereafter otherwise winners will forfeit their prize.
- The competitor may enter as many shows as they wish, but their final score will be the average score from all the shows they have competed in for the current season.
- In the event of a tie the competitor with the highest number of first place wins then second place wins and so on will be the winner.
- If entries are low, competitors may be paraded together, however each class will be judged separately.
- Prize money at show level is to be provided by the show at \$20 for 1st place, \$10 for 2nd and \$5 for third.
- The highest-scoring Northern District competitors in each of the four classes will receive \$130 for 1st place, \$100 for 2nd, \$75 for 3rd and \$45 for 4th. Selwyn Driver and the Northern District Council sponsor all prize money and the winner of each class will receive a medal awarded by the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand.

- Shows are to record the names of all entrants regardless of placing. All placings are to be made to 6th place
- Points to be awarded as follows:

Judging Guidelines

• Presentation of the competitor

- The competitor is strongly advised to wear a plain white shirt with dark pants and clean, strong boots.
- No open footwear or gumboots are permitted;
- If a hat is worn it must be worn correctly;
- No logos or advertising whatsoever are to be present on any clothing including hats. This includes stud/breed names and breed uniforms.

• Presentation of the animal

- The animal itself is not judged, however general presentation is to be taken into consideration as the competitor is expected to have prepared the animal for the ring.
- The competitor should make sure that the animal is washed and groomed with hair appropriately trimmed and clipped and hooves clean and tidy.
- The halter should be clean and fit the animal correctly. Rope or leather halters are allowed;
- For beef competitors, if a show stick or cane is carried, it is to be used correctly.

• Parading of the animal

- The competitor should aim to display the animal in such a manner that the judge gains a clear view of the animal at all times, and that the animal is seen to advantage.
- They should know the weaknesses of the animal and not place the animal in a situation where these are going to be made obvious;
- They should be able to walk in tandem with the animal, without getting their foot caught under the animal's hoof;
- They should be aware of different leading styles: dairy competitors lead from the front while beef lead from the shoulder
- Senior competitors may be asked to swap animals with other competitors. Juniors will not.

If insufficient entries are received, these classes will parade together but be judged separately
