Using the Casual Equine Start System \$15.00 day 1 + \$10.00 per day for subsequent days

3. Horse accommodation – \$40 covered yards/stables (limited available), \$20 open yards.
4. Ground levy – \$15/horse Max \$60. \$10 St John Levy/rider.
5. Powered camping sites, \$30 for show. Limited sites.
6. Late entries – 25% extra, class changes \$3.00. Scratching's less 25%.
7. Prize money for non-series classes will be paid out on 1:7 ratio of starters
8. ESNZJ & SH Rules and series conditions apply
9. ESNZ Jumping/Show Hunter Levy \$5 per horse for the show

Article 50 – Boots

- a) For the age group classes at the Young Horse Show (Four ,Five, Six and Seven) All hind leg protections must have a maximum interior length of 16cm, the width of the fastener must be at least 5cm.
 - b) The inside of the protection must be smooth. Only non-elastic Velcro-type fasteners are permitted, no hooks, buckles, clips or other methods of attaching the fasteners may be used.
 - c) The rounded rigid part of the protection must be placed around the inside of the fetlock.
 - d) No additional elements may be used in conjunction with the protection.
 - e) Hind boot that have an extra flap for protection should be allowed providing the flap is soft and is clearly intended for protection only.
 - f) Sheepskin linings are allowed.
12. Boot and bandage checks will be carried out during age group classes.
 13. All horses competing in age group series classes must have identification papers present with the horse diagram, accurately completed by a registered veterinarian and have full registration.
 14. To be eligible for the style prize, horses must not be wearing any hind boots other than fetlock boots intended for preventing brushing.
 15. **NO DOGS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS.**

Annex 1 - Code of Conduct

WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The following is a Code of Conduct based on that promoted by the FEI, but includes a few minor changes to reflect the New Zealand environment.

Code of Conduct

1. In all Equestrian sports the horse must be considered paramount.
2. The well-being of the horse shall be above the demands of breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.
3. All handling and veterinary treatment must ensure the health and welfare of the horse.
4. The highest standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times.
5. Adequate provision must be made for ventilation, feeding watering and maintaining a healthy environment when horses are being transported.
6. Emphasis should be placed on increasing education in training and equestrian practices and promoting scientific studies in equine health
7. In the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.
8. All riding and training methods must take account of the horse as a living entity and must not include any technique considered by the ESNZ to be abusive.
9. The ESNZ will establish adequate controls in order that all persons and bodies under their jurisdiction respect the welfare of the horse.
10. The National and International Rules and Regulations in Equestrian sport regarding the health and welfare of the horse must be adhered to, not only during national and international events, but also in training. Competition Rules and Regulations shall be continually reviewed to ensure such welfare is upheld.

By entering or attending the National Young Horse Jumping Championships competition, you accept that you may appear within differing media streams that are on location covering the event. Your behaviour at the event and within the competition arena is at your discretion and is your responsibility. Please note that there might be live streaming at the event therefore the camera is on throughout the day.”
