RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Entries close Thursday 13th March 2025.
- 2. Entry Fees are as stated at the beginning of each section in this schedule. All entries received online or by email must be paid in full by internet banking within 3 days of submitting entries to be considered entered. A \$5.00 Administration fee (per person/rider) applies to all entries.
- 3. All care will be taken but the society will not be held responsible for loss or damage or mis-delivery of exhibits at the show.
- 4. Home Industries must be in the hall on Saturday 22nd March 2025 before 1pm. Wool to be at the hall by 10am on Saturday 22nd March 2025. No late entries or exhibits will be accepted.
- 5. No exhibit is to be removed from the grounds or hall before 3pm except by permission of the Committee. All items must be collected between 4pm and 5pm on the day of the show. Otherwise, items will be donated to a charity unless prior arrangement has been made with Convenor.
- 6. Judging will start at the times stated in each section of this schedule.
- 7. Judges may not award a prize in any section where there is not sufficient merit. Their decision in all cases shall be final. Where there are only 2 entries, 1st prize may only be awarded. Champions will also be at the discretion of the Judge on the day, and their decisions will be final.
- 8. All entries in livestock sections shall be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. All produce and field roots must be grown and produced by the Exhibitors. All exhibits in the jams and preserves, baking, art and crafts sections must be the bona fide work of the Exhibitor.
- 9. All horses and ponies to be ridden at walking pace except when being judged, or in designated areas.
- 10. Stallions are permitted in all classes they are eligible for. Refer to CDE Rule 14 RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book.
- 11. All horses and ponies in Sporting Events to have back numbers.
- 12. The Committee reserves the right to substitute goods for cash as prizes in any section or class.
- 13. Admission to show Donation Box on grounds, your support and donation is greatly appreciated.
- 14. The stewards in various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons from interfering with the judges during adjudication. No Exhibitor or other person (except judges, stewards and secretary) will be permitted to go inside the ring while the horses and ponies are being judged, unless where the stewards deem it necessary. No owner of stock shall go inside the ring while his stock is being judged unless said owner is actually in charge of the stock.
- 15. <u>Protests:</u> Protests in writing may be lodged with the secretary with a deposit of \$50.00, such deposit to be forfeited should the protest in the opinion of the Committee be not sustained. If lodged before judging has commenced the onus of proof will rest upon the Exhibitor; if after, the onus of disproof will rest upon the person protesting. The Committee shall have the power to refuse to entertain any protest or complaint lodged more than one hour after the conclusion of the event.
- 16. <u>Late Entries:</u> The Committee shall have the power to accept late entries and may charge a **\$30 late entry fee per** entrant/horse to be paid before the event starts. The Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of transfers in any horse or pony section. Any transfers in Sporting Events from one class to another will be allowed only on the duplication of the entry

fees before the event starts.

- 17. Points will be awarded as follows for the horse section championships where required: 1st prize 5 points; 2nd prize 4 points; 3rd prize 3 points. Where there is only one Exhibitor, half the allocated points will be awarded.
- 18. Home Industry point system and prize allocation procedure is available online at Main-events under the document tab
- 19. Horse show classes will need a current height certificate and will be judged by RAS Judges. (Except for Pony Club Classes)
- 20. Age of Riders/Handlers/Horse/Ponies are as at 1 August 2024.

Some helpful tips for Showing Vegetables

Vegetables must be fresh and clean, do not use a brush to scrub them.

- Potatoes- uniform colour, shape and size.
- Tomatoes- green growing stalks must be attached, have a uniform colour, shape and size.
- Carrots and Beetroot- leave the root on as well as 6cm of stalk on top.
- Leafy vegetable- trim/remove outside leaves.
- Onions- trim the roots slightly, tidy up skin, leave 8-10cms of top which may be tied neatly with a rubber band/string.
- Garlic- trim roots but don't cut completely off, leave short 1-2cm stalks on bulbs
- Beans- must have a stalk intact on the ends with a uniform number of seeds in each pod.
- · Courgettes- of a normal eating size
- Fruit- uniformity of size, colour and shape.

Rhubarb-leave a small piece of the green leaf on the top. Pull/tear the stalk from the crown when harvesting and leave the white piece attached to the stalk. Do not cut.
