Non Graded Championship

Those eligible include Rider Training and competitive members of ESNZ and non members All riders must be CN - C2 Category (NEVER TO HAVE GAINED GRADING POINTS at any level above Level 2 on any horse at any time)

Horse/Pony may be unregistered, or ESNZ registered for training or graded competitions AND not have more than 30 Level 2 or above grading points.

Riders and/or horses/ponies that have competed at CCI* or CIC *Horse Trials or above are NOT eligible for these classes.

Please use the unregistered entry form available on this website under the forms tab to enter. We also require all horses competing in this section to wear identification numbers which will be allocated. Numbers/holders are available to hire from the office for the duration of the show at a cost of \$10 which you can return to the office for a refund at the end of the event. Your horses must also wear ID tags (with name and contact cell phone number) when not competing. These are also available at the office for \$2

Dunstan Horsefeeds DRESSAGE BONANZA

The Dunstan Dressage Bonanza is a new series with the strategic goal of encouraging new and less experienced riders to participate at regional & island championships against riders of similar experience.

Rider Eligibility:

At regional events the Dunstan Bonanza Qualifier is open to training and competitive members of ESNZ & non-members.

At Island Championships, all riders must be ESNZ competitive members.

All riders must be CN - C2 Category (NEVER TO HAVE GAINED GRADING POINTS at any level above Level 2 on any horse at any time)

Riders and / or Horses/ponies that have competed at CCI* or CIC *Horse Trials or above are NOT eligible.

Horse / Pony Eligibility:

At regional events the Dunstan Bonanza Qualifier is open to all horses/ponies with not more than 30 Level 2 or above grading points. Horses may be unregistered, or ESNZ registered for training or graded competitions.

At Island Championships and to qualify for the Dunstan BONANZA National Prizes, all horses must be ESNZ registered for graded competition and have an Annual Dressage Start.

All riders who win a Dunstan Horsefeeds Bonanza class must complete a profile outlining their competition results for the current season & goals for the future & submit this to Dressage NZ. The four National Bonanza winners will be selected by the Dressage NZ selectors from these profiles

There will be two Senior North Island and one Senior South Island winners reflecting the number of events in each island. There will be one National winner for a rider 16yrs & under as at 31st May 2013

Hanoverian Society Sash

Awarded to the two Hanoverians with the highest percentage at this event. A copy of pink papers must be sent with entries to be eligible.

One sash awarded to the Hanoverian from Level 1-3 with the highest percentage and the second sash awarded to the Hanoverian from Level 4 and above with the highest percentage.

Dressage Hawke's Bay Best Performed Pony Club Rider (Sashes to 4th place)

This award is for riders under 21 years, on a horse or pony, who are current financial members of NZPCA. Riders to nominate on their entry forms if they wish to be considered for this award and state their branch/club

The winners will be the combinations with the highest average percentage in their four classes across the one level, scaled for the level at which they are competing, as follows:

In the event of a tie the rider at the highest level will be the winner.

If there still remains a tie the winner will be the rider placed higher in the Challenge class.
