Conditions of Entries

for the SPRING INTO ACTION Horse & Pony Training Show.

This Show is run under the Rules of the RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book. RAS Judges Rule Book are available from Christine Roberts, RAS Equestrian Coordinator, PO Box 54, Woodend.

ENTRIES

- 1 Entries must be made on the Official Entry Forms and accompanied by the total **Entry Fees** and in the hand of the Secretary on or before the closing date advertised in the Schedule.
- 2 All entries must be made in the name of the bona fide owner of the exhibits herein called the Exhibitor.
- 3 A bona fide owner shall include a Partnership or Lease that has been registered with the RAS, for a term of not less that six months and shall commence on receipt of confirmation from the RAS that it has been received.
- 4 Each exhibitor shall have guaranteed to the Association and have given warranty that each Exhibit entered and brought to the Canterbury Agricultural Park is free of any contagious or infectious disease.

GROUND FEES

5 In addition to entries fees, a **ground fee** will be payable at the rate of **\$8.00 per individual animal**.

ENTRY FEES

- 6 Canterbury A&P Association Members:- **\$5.00** Non-Members:- **\$8.00**
- 7 All exhibitors must be members of the Association in their own name to claim or use Members discounted fees. Members
- receive discounted entry rates at both the Spring Into Action Show and the Canterbury A&P Show.

MEMBERSHIP

- 8 Application for membership may be made on the enclosed form.
- 9 Provided that the membership is accompanied by a cheque for the membership subscription and that these are enclosed with the entries, membership discounted entry fees may be claimed.

RIGHTS OF THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE

- 10 The Organising Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without adducing any reason for so doing and reserves the right to make any alterations to the timetable or withdraw any events as may be deemed desirable.
- 11 Any unruly or dangerous animal or exhibit may be required to leave the Grounds.
- 12 The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter conditions or order of events, or cancel events entirely at its own discretion.
- 13 If too many entries are received in any class, the said class may be divided.
- 14 If insufficient entries are received for any class, classes may be combined and entry fees returned where necessary.
- 15 No stallions in Showing or RTR classes as per RAS rules.

REFUNDS

16 The Committee reserves the right to authorise the refund of entry fees at a rate of 75% upon submission of a veterinary or doctors certificate within seven days of the Show.

PRIZES

17 Prize ribbons to 6th place will be awarded in all classes.

SUBSTITUTIONS

18 A Veterinary Certificate must be produced to the Secretary for any horse/pony being substituted.

BACK NUMBERS

19 Breast plate numbers (showing), ESNZ identification type numbers or Sports Numbers only. Sports Numbers/Holders are available from saddleries.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCE TESTING

- 20 Tranquilizers, stimulants, or any drug which affects the performance of Horses or Ponies is forbidden.
- 21 Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the event. Testing of all animals will be at the Owners Risk and will be carried out under FSJC procedures (Ref.10, RAS By Laws and Regulations Sections 55A)
- 22 The Exhibitor or Owner signature on the Entry Form, and or participation in competition denotes acceptance of these conditions.

HORSE FLOAT ENTRY

- 23 All horse floats must enter through Curletts Road.
- 24 All vehicles must be parked in designated areas.
- 25 The Association accepts no responsibility for the loss, theft, injury, or damage to person or vehicle, their contents, fittings or accessories.
- 26 Any vehicle found parked in any area not designated for parking will be towed away without warning and retrieved at the Owners cost.

HORSEBOXES

Charge: \$25.00, Yards \$15.00. Please leave the boxes clean. An account will be sent to the user of any box left uncleaned.
Anyone found *smoking* in the vicinity of the Horseboxes will be fined \$500.

- 28a The Height and Performance Card number must be included on the Entry Form.

Please note measuring fee changes in 2014:

Fees for Measuring, Life & Replacement Certificates

(a) The following charges, inclusive of GST, shall apply nationwide for the measuring service, however individual stands are entitled to charge additional operating costs. First Measure (either annual or youngstock) with issue of certificate: \$30.00. Annual remeasure: \$20.00. Youngstock re-measure: \$10.00. Life Certificate: \$75.00. These fees will be split with 70% remaining with the measuring stand and 30% going to the RAs Head Office.

(b) Replacement Certificate: \$75.00. All replacement certificates (lost certificates, change of horse/pony name etc) must be issued from the RAS Head Office. The person seeking the replacement certificate must apply to the RAS Head Office for their replacement certificate and have received that certificate before taking the animal to the measuring stand for ongoing measured. Any replacement certificates issued directly from the measuring stand will be invalid. Cost for a replacement certificate may be reduced at the discretion of the RAS Head Office.

NOVICE SHOWING CLASSES

- 31 Please note that <u>any wins</u> at the Spring Into Action Training Show <u>will not</u> count for A&P Show grading.
- 31a A Horse or Pony which has not won six (6) firsts in conformation classes at any ridden show including but not exclusive to A&P Show, RAS affiliated Show/Event, Open Pony Club Shows, Open Riding Club Show, Open Breed Show (i.e. Winter Woollies) or Grand National Show at time of Show is eligible for this Show. Once a Horse or Pony has had six (6) wins it is not eligible for Showing Classes at this Show.
- 31b A Horse or Pony which has not won six (6) firsts in P&M Classes at any ridden show including but not exclusive to **A&P Show, RAS affiliated Show/Event, Open Pony Club Show, Open Riding Club Show, Open Breed Show (i.e. Winter Woollies) or Grand National Show** at time of Show are eligible for this Show. Once a Horse/Pony has had six (6) wins it is not eligible for P&M Classes at this Show.
- 31c Horses/Ponies must be shown in Snaffle bits at this Show.
- 31d The age of the Rider is taken as at the day of the Show.
- 31e Horses and Ponies may be ridden by Riders of any age at this Show.

SADDLE HORSE AND PONIES

- 32 No horse or pony under the age of 3 years of age is permitted to be shown under saddle.
- 33 No change of rider will be allowed in any horse or pony classes once entering the Ring for that class.
- A horse or pony being eligible for a Championship must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes which it qualified unless permission of the Chief Horse Steward has been obtained. In the case of a rider qualifying more than one horse or pony, a second rider may be found.
- 34a Horse/Ponies competing in the Showing Section can enter in one section only.

SHOWJUMPING, SHOW HUNTER & DRESSAGE

- 35 These classes will be judged according to the Official Rules of the ESNZ.
- 35a Dressage entries times will be posted on the website or provide a SAE for dressage start times.
- 35b All horses and ponies are restricted to two Dressage classes, two Showjumping classes and two Show Hunter heights (i.e. up to four Show Hunter classes).
- 35c Showjumping and Show Hunter competitors can park around the outside of the Main Arena.

AWARD OF CHAMPIONSHIPS

36 Champion & Reserve Champion will be selected as follows.:- First Prize winners in all eligible classes to be Paraded before the Judge, immediately the Champion has been selected the second prize animal from the class that the champion came from shall be paraded with the other winners for Reserve Champion.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR (RAS Rule Book page 17 Rule 51)

- 37 Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in, schooling or riding for any reason a horse or pony at an A&P Show, or in any area considered to be for whatever reason a part of the Showgrounds at this Show.
- 37a All riders 16 years and under wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at three points. Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within the Showgrounds. Dressage competitors please note that under Dressage NZ Rule 480 black or dark blue NZ Safety approved helmets with harness must be worn in all training, warm ups and competitions.

GENERAL

- 38 Any exhibitor who interferes with or abuses a Judge or Officer of the Association whilst acting in his or her official capacity as such, will be dealt with as may be deemed fitting by the Judicial Committee, and Stewards are instructed to report such occurrence promptly.
- 39 No classes in any section will be held up for competitors entered in other Sections. All approximate starting times excluding Dressage are stated on page 2 of this Schedule.
- 40 The RAS Yellow Card system (as per remit at the 2010 RAS Annual Conference), which will be submitted for any inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the conduct of members, owners, lessees, competitors and/or exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution.

Showmanship Competition

"ATAAHUA STUD" EQUITATION EVENT

Kindly sponsored by Mrs Jeanette Brown.

This Competition aims to promote rider development and provide a basis from which riders can move into other disciplines.

The competition will consist of 4 phases.

Phase 1	Simple Dressage Test	25% of total marks
Phase 2	Individual Ridden Display	25% of total marks
Phase 3	Jumping Test	25% of total marks
Phase 4	In Hand Presentation	25% of total marks

The phases may run consecutively, or in a round-robin manner according to the number of entries. Dressage phase to start at approximately 11am, dependent on dressage entries in other classes.

Jumping Penalties:			

No water jump. To be ridden at Hunting pace.

- a. Any pony/horse taking the wrong course or jumping another fence after completing the course will be eliminated.
- b. If a pony/horse turns its quarters to a fence or has a complete turn round, or crosses its tracks on approach to the next fence a refusal will be given.
- c. Boots (including over-reach boots) are permissible.
- d. Competitors may walk the course dismounted before their class, correctly dressed.
- e. The fall of horse and or rider anywhere on the course will result in elimination. The rider may not attempt another fence but must leave the arena immediately on foot.
- f. Each jumping effort is marked out of 10 for approach, jumping style and rider's position and aids. The double is scored as one obstacle.
- g. There is a four fault penalty for a pole down or a run out, three refusals result in elimination.
- h. Spurs are allowed
- i. Only ordinary Snaffle Bridles are permitted.
- j. Only Flash, Drop or Cavesson nosebands are permitted with Snaffle Bridles.
- k. Martingales, Bearing, Side or Running reins of any kind are **not** permitted.

SPRING INTO ACTION

4 Phase 4 In-Hand Presentation 90 Marks

- a. Riders to perform an In-Hand workout, prescribed by the judge.
- b. This phase is judged on the competitor's ability to present the horse / pony.

Attitude and Conduct Marks

A true showman behaves with style and dignity in the ring, handles mishaps with ease and understands that they are on show at every moment. Competitors begin each phase with a maximum of 10 marks for attitude and conduct. By simply behaving in a respectful and cooperative manner, all competitors should retain their 10 marks. Parents and supporters must also support riders in a respectful way to create a positive competition.

Marks may be deducted for the following:

One or more marks: Behaviour that is less than polite and cooperative to judges, Stewards, or other competiton **Several marks:** Failure to obey direct instructions, talking in the line-up, calling out to spectators / supporters.

Parents or supporters interfering or behaving poorly.

Most of all marks: Abuse of the horse. Abuse of any judge, steward or other competitor.

This Showmanship Competition is open to all riders in the three age groups including riders on open horses/ponies & Pony Club competitors.

Plaiting is required. NZ Safety approved helmets must be worn in the jumping and dressage phases (phases 1 & 3).

In this Section the Judge will be looking for a pony suitable to take its rider safely off the lead rein at all times. First Ridden Ponies must be ridden in a bridle with a single rein. No spurs are to be worn, however a cane or a whip not exceeding 68cm in length with a flap 4cm long by 2cm wide may be carried. All ponies to walk and trot in company and may be asked to canter in their individual workouts. Ponies are not eligible for Leading Rein Pony Section, unless with another Rider. Riders are only eligible to compete in the First Ridden section for a maximum of two Show Seasons. To be judged as follows: 60% Safety and Rideability, 40% Conformation and Paces
