RULES & REGULATIONS

Entries are made and accepted subject to the Rules and Regulations of The Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (RAS – prefixed by letter "R") as amended in June 2011 and including the Definition of Terms, and/or of the Poverty Bay Agricultural & Pastoral Association (PB A&P Assn – prefixed by letter "P") as amended in June 2006. Copies of the Rules and Regulations are obtainable from the Secretary. As from June 2010 the "Yellow Card" system will operate in the Equestrian Section of all RAS affiliated Shows/Events. Implementation of the 'Yellow Card' will be in accordance with the RAS Rules and Regulations. www.ras.org.nz

- Entries in ESNZ classes are made and accepted subject to the Rules and Regulations of Equestrian Sports New Zealand (ESNZ), including the Notification of Official Warning Procedures "ESNZ Official Warning 2013".
- All competitors should be conversant with the Rules and Regulations, which are of particular application to entries in the horse and pony classes, including the following: -
- (P6) Alteration to Course: The Committee reserves the right to make any alteration if a course is defined in any jumping event, without prior notice.
- (P2) Alterations to Programme: The Committee reserves the right to make any alteration in the Show timetable or to postpone the Show, or to withdraw any event, or to amend the conditions of entry into any event as may be deemed advisable.
- (P14) Alteration to Jumping Height Class Entries: Competitors may transfer an entry to a different height class, under the following conditions:
 - intended changes must be notified to the Horse Secretary in writing by 5.00pm on the day immediately prior to the event taking place. AND will compete first in the newly selected classes.

(P3) Dogs: No dogs other than those officially entered in scheduled competitions, shall be permitted on the grounds. This rule applies to EVERYONE entering the grounds. There shall be NO EXCEPTIONS!

(R89) Forbidden Substances: The use of tranquilizers, stimulants, or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society Forbidden Substance Judicial Committee (FSJC) procedures and rules (refer Rule 89 RAS Equestrian Judges and Competitors Rule Book and rules and by-laws of Section 55(a) of the RAS General Rules and Regulations).

(P13) Late Entries: Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions:

- A. the competitor must have formally entered his/her participation in the Show prior to the entry closing date
- B. the horse and/or pony for which an extra entry is sought must have entries recorded for that specific animal prior to the entry closing date.
 - C. any late entry shall incur a penalty of 50% of the prescribed entry fee for that event.
 - D. any such entries must be lodged at the Horse Secretary's office by 5:00pm on the day prior to competition
- E. late entries under this clause shall be the first to compete in the class/classes for which they are late entered and shall be eligible for all the benefits relating to that class/classes.

<u>Note</u>: No late entries will be accepted from any competitors who have missed the closing date and have no prior entries lodged

- (P5) Protests: (also refer R2) any protest is to be lodged no later than 2 hours after the completion of judging and must be lodged with the Secretary of the PB A & P Assn. Any protest is to be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 which is refundable should the protest be upheld. The Judicial Committee shall comprise the President, the Vice-President and the Chief Horse Steward, together with such additional persons as the President may appoint.
- **(P4) Refunds:** The Committee will not accept claims for refunds of entry fees unless the scratching of an entry is made officially in writing to the Secretary either prior to the Show or in sufficient time to avoid disruption to the smooth running of the competition. In the event of scratching(s), entry fees up to a maximum of \$25.00 per horse with a maximum charge for 3 horses shall be retained by the Association. No refund will be made unless the animal concerned is totally scratched from all classes entered. Should an animal sustain injury after the commencement of competitions a scratching refund for the balance of the classes entered will be considered.
- (R51) Safety Helmets: Wearing a hard hat is compulsory for anyone competing on, working in, or schooling or riding for any other reason a horse at the PB A & P Assn Showgrounds Park. All competitors must be properly dressed in accordance with Article 127 and Discipline Rules when appearing before spectators. It is compulsory that all riders wear protective headgear that conforms to the ESNZ or RAS requirements.

ESNZ Helmets must be red tagged, compulsory from 1 August 2017. Helmet standards AS/NZ 3838 (1988, 2003 or 2006), VG1, ASTM-F1163-04 or F1163-15, PAS015:1988 or 2011. Snell E2001. Further information www.nzequestrian.org.nz

RAS compulsory riding helmets: GR4:D. All riders, including harness drivers, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which include a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the area or ring, the

practice collecting rings or anywhere else on the Showgrounds.

(P10) Starting Times: Starting times are approximate only but will be adhered to as closely as possible. Although it is provided that horses may compete in more than one class, any or all of such classes may be judged simultaneously at the convenience of the Judges or Stewards. In all such cases exhibitors having an exhibit entered in more than one class must elect in which class they compete.

(P12) Substitution for Injury: Where an animal has been duly entered and catalogued in any class, the substitution of another animal shall not be permitted except in accordance with R58. All horses and ponies must be named at time of entry. Substitutions must be confirmed by Veterinary certification that the injured animal is unfit to compete

(P11) Substitution of Entries: (also refer R39) - Substitutions in horse or pony classes will be permitted if made in writing to the Horse Secretary in time to avoid disruption to the running of the Show, and provided that:

- 1. The horse or pony for which another entry is substituted may take no further part in the Show; and
- 2. The substitute is of the same grade and/or class as the original entry; and is owned by the same person.

POVERTY BAY COMPETITION CONDITIONS & INFORMATION:

Camping during the Show: Facilities are available during the Show adjacent to the Horse Line and Boxes, with a few powered sites available for the duration at \$35.00 per site. A camping fee of \$15 per truck per show will be charged from Wednesday 11 October.

Camping prior and after show: There will be no admittance to the grounds before Monday 9 October for Equestrian competitors arriving prior to Wednesday 11 October. The grounds must be vacated by Monday 16 October. A standard camping fee of \$15 per person per night will apply for Monday 9th and Tuesday 10th. Powered sites will be charged \$35. These fees are to be paid in advance with your entries. All ablution facilities will be available.

IF YOU ARE ARRIVING AFTER DAYLIGHT HOURS PLEASE ENTER THROUGH GATE 1 - MAIN ENTRANCE ONLY

Catalogues: all competitors shall pay \$6.00 for their Catalogue when making entries. The Catalogue will be available from the Horse Secretary's Office in the foyer of the Indoor Arena from 2pm Wednesday, and outside of the Horse Secretary's office hours, from the Stabling Steward.

Championships: a horse or pony being eligible for a championship must be ridden by the same rider as in the class or classes in which it qualified or have had dispensation from the Chief Steward to substitute the rider because of illness.

Entry Fees and Prize Monies: are as set out in this Schedule of Events.

Prize money will be paid by Direct Credit after the Show.

A Bank account number MUST be supplied with your entry to ensure payment

Measuring Rules: that apply at this Show are those of the RAS. All horses and ponies competing in classes where a height standard is provided may be measured before 8 a.m. on the day of judging.

Contact Mr. P.D. Andrew, Phone 06 867 1865. The Steward in charge may at his discretion, transfer a pony to its appropriate class where it is found on being measured to be wrongly entered.

HEIGHT CERTIFICATES and PERFORMANCE CARDS MUST BE CARRIED EACH DAY OF THE SHOW and presented on demand otherwise a competitor will not be allowed to come

and presented on demand otherwise a competitor will not be allowed to compete.

Jumping Events: the starting order as set down in the Catalogue is drawn by ballot and must be adhered to. All scratching's must be notified to the announcer before the start of each event. All competitors not appearing on time will be disqualified.

Stabling - Stables and Covered Yards: competitors must make application for Yards and Covered Yards on the entry form. Covered Yards and Stallion Boxes are \$40.00 per unit for the duration of the Show. Yards are \$15.00 for the duration of the show. The above accommodation fees must be added to the entry fees. Stallion Boxes are limited and will be issued on a performance basis. All competitors with stallions will be notified by 1st October if unsuccessful. If for any reason the Association is unable to allocate your request, a refund will be payable. This must be claimed at before 11.00am on the Saturday of the Show. All stabling refunds will be paid after the Show. NB: Once the stabling has been allocated, NO REFUND will be payable for scratched horses that have NOT been officially notified prior to Wednesday 11 October.

Starting Times: will appear in the timetable at the back of the Catalogue. These are approximate only, but will be adhered to as closely as possible. Entry Gates will be closed as near as possible to these times, and no late admissions made. The Ring Marshall has the authority to make any timetable alterations necessary to the Programme. Competitors must pay attention to broadcast announcements.

Withholding Tax: you are advised that the IRD deem the winner of prize money in excess of \$500.00 in any one class liable to pay withholding tax of 20% on the amount won in excess of the \$500.00 threshold. If you are entering a class to which this applies, please enter your IRD/GST number in space provided at the top of your entry form.

Use of 2- 3- or 4-wheel motor bikes: in the interests of safety the use of these bikes on the grounds is restricted to daylight hours only. Licensed drivers only may ride these bikes and normal road rules apply at all times. Misuse of such vehicles causing damage to the turf on any part of Showgrounds Park including the One Stop Golf driving range will not be tolerated. I.e. no "wheelies"!

OFF LIMITS! - PLEASE NOTE: All equestrian riders and supporters are advised that ALL Trade Areas, the Windmill Sideshow Amusement Park, the main Camping Ground and other areas are OFF LIMITS during the hours of darkness. You are asked to please stay within the confines of the Horse Lines after dark. Security personnel will be on the grounds and this policy will be strictly enforce

HEALTH & SAFETY:

I declare that:

- 1. My accepted entry into the Event will not be transferred to another entrant.
- 2. In the event of any "act of God" conditions causing a cancellation of the Event, I agree that my total entry fee is not transferable or refundable.
- 3. I and my horses or ponies I am riding are in an appropriate physical condition to participate in the Event, given the known parameters of the Evet. (such as the length, time, physical demand and environmental context)
- 4. I have taken medical advice on any pre-existing medical conditions, and confirm that it is medically safe for me to participate in the Event
- 5. I acknowledge that there are risks involved in the Event. I fully realise the dangers of participating in the Event and fully assume the risks associated with my participation and wellbeing and safety during and after the Event. I understand and acknowledge that the Event organisers (including all officials and event volunteers) provide no warranties, regarding my wellbeing and safety.
- 6. I understand and agree that situations may arise during the Event, which may be beyond immediate control of the Event organisers (including all officials and event volunteers)
- 7. I will participate in the Event in a manner that does not endanger either myself or others.
- 8. I agree that to the extent permissible by law, the Event organisers (including all officials and event volunteers), the sponsors and other parties associated with the Event, have no liability to me whatsoever for any direct or indirect loss, (including, but not limited to injury or death) sustained by me during or in any way related to my participation in the Event
- 9. I authorize the use of my name, voice, picture and information on this entry form in any broadcast, telecast, promotion, advertising, and in any other way, without payment to me or any other form of compensation.
- 10. I agree to comply with the rules and regulations pertaining to the Event.
- 11. I agree to follow all reasonable safety instructions provided to me by the Event organisers (including all officials and event volunteers) before, during and after the Event.
- I consent to receiving medical treatment in the event of illness or injuries suffered during or immediately after the Event.

CLASSES

NON GRADED - horses and ponies (classes will be split if sufficient entries).

- Combinations may enter two introductory/non-graded tests only.
- Non graded combinations that have previously won two champions must ride at the next level.
- Horses/ponies may be unregistered, or ESNZ registered for non-graded or graded competitions AND not have more than 30 Level 2 or above grading points.
- Combinations outside the above criteria may compete HC.

Classes 100-105 are open to CN riders (newcomer riders who have never earned grading points at any level at any time

in their life).

Classes 106-112 are open to C1 and above riders (riders with grading points).

Classes 113-130 Graded - Combinations entering these classes may enter three tests.

ESNZ Membership and Registration

- All riders must have a FULL ESNZ rider membership to compete in jumping / showhunter classes. Introductory and community members or Casual Membership (\$10/day) may only compete in Introductory classes (ponies 80cm and below; horses 90cm and below – no prize money)
- All horses / ponies must have a FULL ESNZ registration and a paid annual jumping / showhunter start to compete in ANY Series class.
- Horses / Ponies not registered may use the jumping / showhunter discipline Casual Levy (\$20 / show). Height restrictions apply; horses 1.10m maximum; ponies 1.00m maximum
- Horses and ponies competing under the Casual Jumping/Show Hunter levy may start in HOY qualifying 1 classes but they will not gain any HOY points, and are unable to start in any Show Hunter series classes.
- 2 Riders must have a fully paid ESNZ Rider Membership to compete in ANY Show Hunter Classes.
- 3 All Show Hunter Classes will be run under ESNZ Show Hunter Rules V10 2017 and ESNZ Show Hunter **Equitation Series Conditions 2017**

- All Show Hunter Classes will be run under ESNZ Show Hunter Rules V10 2017 and ESNZ Show Hunter **Equitation Series Conditions 2017**

ESNZ Membership and Registration

- All riders must have a FULL ESNZ rider membership to compete in jumping / showhunter classes. Introductory and community members or ESNZ Casual Membership (\$10/day) may only compete in Introductory classes (ponies 80cm and below; horses 90cm and below - no prize money)
- All horses / ponies must have a FULL ESNZ registration and a paid annual jumping / showhunter start to compete in ANY Series class.
- Horses / Ponies not registered may use the jumping / showhunter discipline Casual Levy (\$20 / show). Height restrictions apply; horses 1.10m maximum; ponies 1.00m maximum
