Jumping conditions

1. All classes run under ESNZ rules.
2. Riders, horses and ponies must have current registration for the duration of the show.
3. Dress code – formal standard of dress is required.
4. Classes will be run on Saturday evening from 6.30pm in the NRM & McMillan Indoor Arena.
5. Equidays has the right to limit the number of entries.
6. Class entry fee includes ground fee and entrance into Equidays:
 - Entering 2x horses receives 2x wristbands - for rider and a helper.
 - Entering 3+ horses receives 3x wristbands - for the rider and two helpers.
7. In the event of oversubscription riders may be limited to one entry.
8. A non-refundable \$10 admin fee per rider applies.
9. A \$5 ESNZ jumping levy is applicable to each horse entered.
10. Entries close Wednesday 3 October 2018. Please enter online at www.main-events.co.nz.
11. A \$20 ground fee per horse applies.
12. Late entries will incur a 25% late fee and will be put on a wait list.
13. Scratchings – refund for all classes and other fees less 25%. Subject to proof of inability to compete. Subject to conditions and refund form being completed within 7 days of the event. Stable fees will be fully refunded up until 9 October 2018.
14. All prize money will be paid via internet banking.
15. Equidays reserves the right to exchange cash for product to a maximum of 50%.
16. Stables: \$25 per night.
17. **All stallions must be stabled when not ridden.**
18. Equidays reserves the right to alter, delete or amend any class as it sees fit.
19. No motorbikes allowed.



Rules for Equidays event

CONDITIONS

All competitors, exhibitors and participants must comply with the appropriate legislation including the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015. Each competitor, exhibitor and participant must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves at the venue of the event.

EQUIDAYS HEALTH AND SAFETY CONDITIONS

Equidays has a zero harm policy and the safety of all people working at or visiting our venue is of the utmost importance to us. We appreciate your efforts in ensuring your site is safe at all times and that you take all reasonable practicable steps to ensure your own safety and take no action or inaction that causes harm to any other person.

Anyone participating in clinics or competitions associated with ESNZ disciplines, those attending the Pony Club Camp and any treks or pony rides must wear a helmet, however we strongly advise that ALL riders wear a helmet when training, competing and exhibiting to minimise the risk of injury in the event of an accident.

VENUE RULES

- Competitors understand the risks associated with riding horses and acknowledge that your participation is informed and voluntary.
- No dogs or pets are permitted on the Equidays site.
- No digging, drilling or pegs are permitted without approval of the Equidays operations team due to live power, water and data cabling underground.
- Any machinery or equipment must be certified, compliant and in safe working condition.
- The site speed limit is 15km/h.
- All vehicles onsite must drive on the roads only. Damage to sites by vehicle access, parking, manoeuvring or deliveries may result in penalties or remediation by the exhibiting company responsible for the damage.
- All vehicles must have a fire extinguisher
- All incidents, accidents or near misses must be reported to Equidays staff.
- Any fuels, gas or hazardous substances must be stored.

Hazards include but are not limited to:

Horses and Ponies, Contour of Property, Weather Conditions, Equipment and Obstacles, Buildings & Gateways, Water and Water Troughs, Movement of Vehicles

FEI Code of Conduct

- In all equestrian sports the horse must be considered paramount. The well-being of the horse shall be above the demands of breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organisers, sponsors or officials.
- All handling and veterinary treatment must ensure the health and welfare of the horse.
- The highest standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times.
- Adequate provision must be made for ventilation, feeding, watering and maintaining a healthy environment during transportation.
- Emphasis should be placed on increasing education in training and equestrian practices and on promoting scientific studies in equine health. In the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider shall be regarded as essential.
- All riding and training methods must take account of the horse as a living entity and must not include any technique considered by the FEI to be abusive.
- National Federations should establish adequate controls in order that all persons and bodies under their jurisdiction respect the welfare of the horse.
- The national and international Rules and Regulations in equestrian sport regarding the health and welfare of the horse must be adhered to not only during national and international events, but also in training.
- Competition Rules and Regulations shall be continually reviewed to ensure such welfare.

Equidays staff will be monitoring the site at all times. Failure to comply with venue rules may result in you being requested to leave the premises.
