Fees

Entry Fees must accompany all entries. Late Entries will be charged an additional \$15. Refund of entry fees will only be considered if scratchings are made officially with the Livestock Secretary either prior to the Show or in sufficient time to avoid disruption to the smooth running of the competition.

i.e. full refund if scratching is made before Thursday 1st March, 75% refund if scratching is made before Thursday 7th March 2019, 4pm. No refund will be given after this time unless a vet certificate is produced. Yard fees will be refunded in full. If a veterinary certificate is produced refunds will be in

HEALTH & SAFETY WHEN VISITING THE SHOW

Please abide by the safety rules and signage at the Showgrounds.

Follow instructions from Marshalls and Show officials.

In the event of an emergency, please follow ALL instructions given to you by Show Staff.

Parents ensure that children do not enter livestock pens or enclosures. DO NOT poke, hit or irritate animals. Be aware of stock movement when walking through the livestock areas.

Please ensure that you and children in your care do not stand behind horses, cows and bulls. They may not see you there.

If visiting the Show with small children we suggest you write your cell phone number on their arm. Should they become separated from you; staff can then easily notify you. A Parent Centre and Lost Child Centre is located at the Plunket Tent on Pembroke Park

YELLOW CARD SYSTEM

- ii Inappropriate behaviour towards Show Officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the RAS affiliated Show/Event, including registered Measuring stands and their grounds, bringing the A&P movement into disrepute. or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or exhibitors as provided.
 - Equine –refer to the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook

- 2. All Persons responsible, including equestrian -refer to rule 8 under Disruptive or Unacceptable Behaviour, RAS Showing Rules or Regulations.
- Rule 13 of the RAS Constitution

Inappropriate behaviour constitutes any behaviour deemed by the President of the Show or their duly appointed delegate and/or Chief Steward of the Section/Stand involved that brings the A&P movement into disrepute including but not limited to inappropriate language, swearing, cheating or deliberately attempting to work outside of the generally accepted show rules and protocols. This also extends to inappropriate written communication via Facebook. Twitter, text, on-line forums and the

Rules and Conditions

- E1a. LOCALS: refers to competitors residing within the areas bounded by Lindis Saddle, Makarora; Crown Range; Victoria Bridge and Cromwell.
- E1b. CENTRAL OTAGO: refers to competitors of Central Otago Pony Clubs at Maniototo; Clyde: Cromwell: Teviot Valley: Wakatipu and Hawea/ Wanaka, and must wear pony club uniform and be a current financial member

Age and Height. Rider and Horse

- Open pony exhibits must be ridden by riders E2a. under seventeen years of age. Novice ponies may be ridden by riders of any age.
- E2b. Rider/Handlers' age and eligibility is determined as per the 1st August ie. Riders/ Handlers' who are of age for any division/ section on the 1st August complete the show year/season in that division/section.
- Riders 16 years and under cannot compete in both Horse and Pony rings. Must be in one or the other.
- No Horse or Pony under 3 years old is permitted to be shown under saddle
- E2e. Ponies 148cm and under excluded from all Horse events

Eligibility

- E3a. Entires eligible provided that the RAS Rule CDE 14 is complied with and that the Livestock Secretary is notified and satisfied that all requirements are fulfilled.
- Stallions are not to be tied up unattended unless in an appropriate confinement. It is recommended that stallions be kept in approved suitable yards. At the time of entry,

- all stallion owners must be in the possession of a stallion identification badge, which must be displayed at the yard and on the horse at all times while at the Show. Official badges are available at a cost from NZEF.
- E3c. In the warm up area, a stallion must be accompanied by at least one attendant, in addition to the rider, and the stallion badge must be on the horse.
- E3d. All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading (whether by invitation or by entry) must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.
- E3e. All entrants for these classes must be able to provide hunt qualification cards showing that the combination of horse and rider hunted with the Central Otago hounds the previous hunt season before the show. These hunt cards must be photocopied and sent in with entries, and also presented at time of presentation of ribbons. To receive a qualification card the rider/owner is a financial member. To qualify in the hack classes the combination should have hunted 5 times, and pony combinations hunted 3 times.

Protests, Judges' & Committee's Rights

- E4a. The Stewards in the various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges during adjudication and no exhibitor or other person otherwise than the Judge, Stewards and Livestock Secretary will be permitted to go inside the ring while the exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary.
- E4b. The Committee may reserve the right to allot Specials in lieu of prize money mentioned in this schedule
- E4c. All Protests to be lodged with the Livestock Secretary accompanied with a deposit of \$50, within half an hour of adjudication and if, in the opinion of the committee such protest is deemed frivolous, the deposit to be forfeited.
- E4d. The Committee will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for

- any loss, damage or mis-delivery of stock or other exhibits at the Show.
- E4e. Any person infringing the rules of the Society will be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50. The attention of exhibitors is particularly directed to the foregoing provisions which will be strictly enforced, or will revert to the funds of the Society.
- F4f The decision of the Committee shall be absolutely final on any subject on Show Day.
- E4a. Officials have the power in the equestrian sections to move stock to their correct classes with the approval and on advice of Judges.
- E4h. Any exhibitor or person in any way interfering with or using improper language to the Judges or any officer of the Society in, or as to, the execution of their duty, or being guilty of improper conduct on the Showground, may be disqualified upon exhibiting in future shows of the Society, and if exhibiting at this Show, may forfeit all prizes he or she has won.
- F4i Reservation of right. The organizers reserve the right
 - · To cancel any class or event
 - · To divide any class and amend prize money accordingly
 - · To alter the advertised times
 - · To refuse any entry (with or without stating a reason)
 - · To alter or amend the programme as the organizer sees fit
 - · Any unruly or dangerous animal may be required to leave the Showground.
- E4i. The RAS 'Yellow Card' system; please read full rule wording under the General Information Section of this schedule.
- E4k. The Committee reserves the right to cap entry numbers in any section, regardless of entry closure date.
- E4I. The Committee reserves the right to merge classes if entry numbers are low.

Novice Criteria

- E5a. A novice horse or pony is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P Show.
- F5b The owner of any horse or pony that has upgraded since their entry was received must notify the Livestock Secretary so that

- the necessary adjustments can be made. If a Horse or Pony has upgraded at another A & P show after entry has been received by the Livestock Secretary then no fee for alteration will apply providing proof of upgrade is shown and the Livestock Secretary is notified by 4pm on Monday 4th March.
- F5c Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. All wins in Novice section within each division count and must be recorded. Should a novice horse win an Open conformation class, these wins must also be recorded. Once a horse has achieved 6 wins in either the conformation or Paced and Mannered. this horse is not eligible to return to Novice status should it change sections at the beginning of the new season. A Novice is a horse or pony which has not won 6 firsts in relevant classes at the time of the Show. not at the time of entry. See E5b for upgrade details.

ENTRY FEES. SCRATCHING. REFUNDS. PAY OUTS & CLASS CHANGES

- E6a. All livestock entries close with the Livestock Secretary on FRIDAY 8TH FEBRUARY 2019

- E6c. If a veterinary certificate is produced refunds will be in full.
- E6d. All prize winners in horse, cattle, sheep and boer goat sections are expected to join in the Grand Parade.
- Equestrian Levies entry fee includes RAS E6e. Levy of \$1.15 per class.
- E6f. All Livestock prize money will be directed credited after the show. Please include your

- name and bank account number on your Entry Form.
- E6g. The Judges are empowered to withhold the prize-money in any department in which there are not sufficient entries.
- E6h. Competitors may not receive ribbon, cards or money unless they can produce their Height and Performance Card upon request in a height specific class.
- E6i. All wins in novice and open classes within each division count and must be recorded on the Royal Agricultural Society Performance and Measuring Card. Winners failing to produce their card when requested by the Steward forfeit their awards for the day.

Forbidden substance - any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

- Arrears: No person who is in arrears with E9a. regard to entry fees, subscriptions or any other Show charge is eligible to compete at any A & P Show. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.
- F9h Whips must not be over 76cm in length and with a suitable flapper, with the exception in First Ridden where the whip must not exceed 68cm including the flapper.
- E9i. Please ensure that the vards are cleaned out after use and all rubbish put in the skips provided. Competitors leaving dirty yards will not be allocated yards the following year.

- · Strictly no exercising of horses on Pembroke Park. You are allowed to hop on and ride through to the Main Arena only
- No horses to be tied to floats, penned/yarded overnight on Pembroke Park or any other area apart from allotted A&P yards.
- No grazing of horses outside of either designated float parking areas.
- The use of temporary and or electric fencing is prohibited (RAS ruling)
- The Hunt Ring is open for exercising from 6am Friday morning till start of competition (7.45am Friday & 8.30 am Saturday) and closes at 10pm Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.
- The Main Ring is closed at all times, outside of competition.
- No access to the lake until 7.00am Sunday morning. (OSH requirement) Please note that if you do go down, there are holes that will
 easily trip your horse up. At no time will the A&P be held responsible if there is an incident/injury to property or persons if a horse gets loose.
- If conditions of entry are not adhered to the Upper Clutha A & P Committee and the contracted Security Company have the right to remove you and your property from the show grounds and camping area and refuse right of entry.

TICKETING ALLOCATION

- Each exhibitor will be issued with 4 x 1 day passes.
- · Additional tickets must be purchased prior to the show

PARKING PASS ALLOCATION

Each exhibitor will be issued with 1 x Parking pass for their truck/vehicle + float only. Registrations numbers MUST be supplied

All other vehicles are to park outside the float parking area.

HELMET SAFETY STANDARDS

ALL HELMETS MUST COMPLY WITH THE SAFETY STANDARDS AS SHOWN.

A new rule introduced into the ESNZ General Regulations will see all riders competing in ESNZ disciplines having to wear approved safety helmets from 1st August 2017.

The ESNZ rule now states that all riders must wear an approved safety helmet in competition – the accepted safety standards can be found at all times on the ESNZ website. Many helmets have been checked and tagged by stewards, gear checkers and officials throughout the 2016-17 season so riders are all ready by 1 August 2017. Helmet checking and tagging will continue at events, and some special helmet tagging sessions, indefinitely.

ESNZ and New Zealand Pony Clubs Association have signed a joint memorandum of understanding to support the single tagging policy for New Zealand equestrian events and activities held by either of the two organisations.

As such, a joint ESNZ/NZPCA branded helmet tag has been produced. Once tagged, with the new red tag, a helmet will be allowed to be worn at all events and activities of either organisation.

Please note: RAS will also be following the lead of NZPCA and ESNZ with regards to helmet standards and tagging of helmets.
