

2021 Annual Show Cattle (Dairy and Beef Breeds) Entry Requirements

# THE RULES



- 1. Entries close online at <a href="https://main-events.com/">https://main-events.com/</a> on the 11th of October 2021. The Wairarapa Agricultural and Pastoral Show (Wairarapa A&P Show) Secretary will permit NO late entries or substitute entries, to ensure full compliance with the Wairarapa A&P Society's Show Biosecurity Plan.
- 2. The term 'Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary' means the respective Dairy and Beef Section Stewards, as applicable, in this document, who are the delegated cattle management authorities for the Wairarapa A&P Show Committee.
- 3. All animals entered must be named on entry form along with the RFID Nait number of each individual animal (Instructions on how to find each animal's Nait RFID number are at page 4).
- 4. In accordance with Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand (RAS) codes, all entries must be registered with a RAS affiliated Society or under 12 months of age and be eligible for registration.
- 5. Entries are submitted subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society, copies are available from the Show Secretary.
- 6. The Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary reserves the right to combine judging classes if insufficient entries are received.

- 7. All entry fees are GST inclusive. A GST Tax Invoice/Receipt can be supplied on request from the Show Secretary.
- 8. An emailed e-ticket will be sent to each exhibitor via the Eventfinda e-ticket system. To obtain entrance to the Showgrounds this e-ticket needs to be scanned at the livestock entrance gate. Exhibitors will be issued two entrance tickets for personal and your support person to use, at the entrance gate on site entry.
- 9. Prize money: 1<sup>st</sup> \$20, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$10 and 3<sup>rd</sup> \$5, unless otherwise stated.
- 10. All prize money is paid by direct credit. Please ensure your correct bank account number is supplied with your entry to the Show Secretary.
- 11. All animals are to be marshalled on site at the Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary's direction. The Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary will schedule and manage access to the animal Bio-Security Wash Bay facilities. The Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary will discuss Biosecurity arrangements with exhibitors and agree the Biosecurity protocols with each exhibitor once entries have been submitted and accepted by the Show Secretary.
- 12. Exhibitors must display, on each animal entered, an operable NAIT approved Radio Frequency Identification Display (RFID) tag, necessary to obtain entry to the Wairarapa A&P Show site. Exhibitors agree that they will ensure that they comply with Ministry of Primary Industries Animal Handling Codes, NAIT, and the Wairarapa A&P Show Secretary's directives at all times during the Wairarapa A&P Show.
- 13. Every and any objection or protest must be made in writing within one hour of judging of each class, and signed by the person making the objection(s) and delivered to the Show Secretary along with the sum of \$50 which shall be forfeited to the Society should the objection be considered frivolous, vexatious, dishonest, misleading. or incomplete, following appropriate investigation by the Secretary in consultation with approved judges. The Show Secretary's decision is final.
- 14. Trophies will be presented to exhibitors and it is the responsibility of such exhibitor to have trophies engraved at exhibitor's expense and in keeping with the lettering style used on each trophy. Custody of all trophies presented requires an acknowledged receipt by the awarded exhibitor, which shall be lodged with the Show Secretary before removal trophy from the Show site.
- 15. All 2019 trophy holders are requested to return awarded trophies to the Society prior to Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October 2021. Please ensure all damaged trophies have been repaired, engraved and have been cleaned.

## **Show Age Group Classing**

- Age of cattle to be calculated at 1<sup>st</sup> June 2021
- Any bull born prior to 1 June 2019 must enter the bull 2-year-old class and over.
- Females born prior to 1<sup>st</sup> June 2018 must enter the Senior Cow 3 year and over class.
- Females born between 1<sup>st</sup> June 2018 and 1 June 2019 must enter the 2-year-old class.
- Animals born between 1<sup>st</sup> June 2020 and 1 June 2021 must enter the yearling class.
- Animals born since 1<sup>st</sup> June 2021 are only eligible to enter the calf classes.

- Any bull over12 months of age and over, must have and use a nose ring fitted for handling.
   Animals are to be attended at the ring and under competent supervision at all times while on the Show Grounds Complex.
- All bulls two years and over must have two leaders and be under competent supervision.
- All bulls must be securely tied in the stalls by an adequate chain around the neck or a stout leather collar with an adequate rope attached, as well as a halter, to the satisfaction of the Show Secretary.
- Please bring your own water feeders for your cattle. There are no common troughs available under these rules.
- The Hicks Family Pavilion/ Pig Pavilion vehicle loading ramps are off limits at all times.
- All cattle must be entered in the name of the Nait registered owner.
- All animals must be named on entry form with individual Nait RFID number including pairs or group classes.
- Animal Cruelty is NOT acceptable in any way including but not limited to excessive handling or medical manipulation.

## Nait Compliance Definition and Requirements

All stock must be NAIT registered and in accordance with OSPRI and TBfree New Zealand. Nait and TBFree are OSPRI Animal Traceability Programmes. Regardless of age they must be:

- Departing from a property that is registered with a NAIT number and TBfree NZ herd number accompanied with a copy of a valid Animal Status Declaration form.
- Fitted with a valid NAIT RFID tag and registered in the NAIT system.
- Registered in a movement to the event NAIT number (454124) from the animal's current NAIT number no later than Friday 29th October. Please bring a copy of your Nait transfer with you.
- Registered in a return movement from the event NAIT number to their destination (receiving NAIT number) within 48 hours of departure.
- All stock over 90 days of age travelling from within a TBfree Movement Control Area must be pre-movement tested within 60 days of arriving at the event.
- All TBfree forms and Nait transfers will be collected upon arrival and animals Nait tag scanned on the transport vehicle (Please do not unload until your animals from transport until a Steward has electronically recorded their RFID Number).
- In accordance with MPI regulations the Wairarapa A&P Show Society operates a policy of No Nait, No Show, and No exceptions.
- ALL ANIMALS ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE OWNER

## Biosecurity and Wairarapa A&P Show Practice Policy

Wairarapa A&P Society take Biosecurity very seriously so we require our competitors to please adhere to the following rules:

- Animal wash bays must be sprayed down with the Virkon Disinfectant supplied before and
  after each stud use, and kept clean at all times. One stud only at a time per washbay as per
  the time slot agreed.
- No new cattle exhibitor can be stalled in a pen previously used by another stud exhibitor, unless all bedding has been removed and replaced with fresh bedding with all rails and flooring disinfected (fully sprayed wet) with Virkon Disinfectant.
- Unless an animal is either at the wash bay, in the ring or moving between, all animals must be kept within their stalling area at all times.
- Please do not share buckets, troughs, brushes or grooming equipment with other exhibitors.
- There will be Hand Sanitizer provided at the pavilion.
- In the interest of Biosecurity a "keep left" and "give way" to the right" approach will be taken for animals entering and exiting the stalls and using raceways' 2-metre gap between exhibitor stalls must be adhered to at all times to the satisfaction of the Stewards.
- Any exhibitor that has cattle that require milking will need to provide their own milking system.
- All electrical equipment to have a current electrical compliance safety tag fitted.
- All exhibitors are responsible for keeping their stalls clean and tidy at all times, including dung removal. To assist with this each exhibitor will be given an area with which to store their show gear.
- There is a NO SMOKING / NO VAPING policy in the Society's Merv Renall Cattle Pavilion it is the responsibility of entrants to remind the public of this.
- If you are requiring extra people to attend to assist you, please ensure they are fully compliant with the above Bio-Security rules.




#### How to locate your Nait RFID Number.

To find EACH individual animal RFID number you must have the animal registered in the NAIT system. If you need help with this, please visit ospri.co.nz or call 0800 482 463.

If your animal is already registered with Nait, you then need to log on to NAIT with your NAIT Account ID number and then click on "registered animals" on the drop down screen menu as shown in the example below:



The RFID number is then showing in the second column as below
