HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

Central and Southern HB Show Jumping Group is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all staff, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this.

The full Health and Safety Policy documents are available at any time in the Secretary's office.

We will take all practicable steps by;

- Providing a safe event, safe equipment and proper materials
- Identifying and monitoring hazards and using the hazard management

hierarchy of eliminate, isolate or minimise.

- Insist upon establishment of safe methods and best practices
- Comply with all H&S legislation, regulations and codes of practice

We will take responsibility for health and safety procedures, however, ALL PEOPLE ON THIS SITE need to be aware of their responsibilities and comply with the event's health and safety policy.

COMPETITORS will be responsible for themselves at ALL times by observing safe practices and rules/instructions relating to their competition.

Every person involved in Central and Southern HB Show Jumping Group is encouraged to play a vital and responsible role in maintaining a safe and healthy event through:

- Being involved in the event health and safety system.
- Following correct procedures.
- Safe and proper use of equipment.
- Wearing protective clothing and equipment as and when required.
- Reporting any pain or discomfort as soon as possible.
- Ensuring all accidents and incidents are reported.
- Help new employees, trainees and visitors to understand the right safety procedures and why they exist.
- Informing the office immediately of any health and safety concerns.
- Keeping the event facilities tidy to minimise the risk of any trips and

falls.

Shared walkways - pedestrians, vehicles and horses share common walkway areas. Riders should walk through these areas paying particular notice to pedestrians - and should wait or go off the track if possible when a vehicle is already committed to using it. Pedestrians should walk at the sides, in single file, and give way to horses to reduce the risk of being knocked.

Vehicles should travel under 10 km/hr and should stop and turn off their engine should a horse become upset and/or unmanageable.

Bikes (motorised or cycles) are to be ridden with a safety helmet at all times, and not exceed 10 km/hr. Motorised bikes are not to be ridden after 8 pm or before 6 am.

Dogs are not allowed on the Dannevirke A&P Showgrounds. It is a working farm and no outside dogs are permitted

We ask you to warm-up in the arena related to your class to allow for sufficient distancing of riders and supporters.

Gatherings between competitors in trucks is discouraged

We ask that you do not congregate in stables, sheds etc in inclement weather – go to your cars/trucks

Everyone entering the grounds must sign in for contact tracing purposes using the NZ Covid tracing app or manually sign in. You must also sign into each zone, facility and ring. Covid tracing helps stop the virus. Correctly Covid Tracing will help allow the continuation of our sport.

Please do not congregate in groups. Your support and commitment to Covid-19 requirements is super important to ensuring our sport can continue to operate under Level 2.

Please be sensible and respectful of putting photos on social media. All photos should show compliance with our rules and guidelines, eg do not post people not wearing masks while they are eating lunch in the background

You are responsible for your own hygiene and adherence to the Covid19 regulations

You need to provide your own hand sanitiser

Although there will be qualified first aiders on the grounds you are responsible for your own first aid and any supplies required

Failure to comply with these rules and guidelines will result in scratching your entries, no refund, removal from the grounds. ESNZ will be informed.
